
MD31L NEWS: DECEMBER 2024







Help us make this the best year ever!



Chase: -Volunteering through local churches serving meals,

Etowah: -Financial assistance to the McCune Community

Gastonia: -Collection and corporate sponsorship of relief supply donations; financial donations to disaster relief

Greater Asheville: The club is staying tight knit in assisting their community and needs.

-Bought clothing for veteran's who's living quarters were flooded

-Serves meal for 225 veterans monthly

-Purchased 19 pairs of eyeglasses to assist those lost in the natural disaster

-Replenished groceries for a blind lady that were lost in the storm in addition to a couch, chair, and phone to aid to reading her insulin pump.

Hendersonville: -Financial assistance to relief efforts

Lake Lure: The Lake Lure is actively involved in relief efforts and will be for years to come.

-The club has been blessed with donations amounting to over \$10k and counting from lions clubs located all over the USA. The Lake Lure Lions Club is setting up a relief fund to oversee the use of these funds as they assist their community members in rebuilding their town. The club assisted with relocation of an individual.

We sold some brooms and had a donation jar for the Veterans Healing farm and made over \$80 for them.









The Long View Lions Club, EnChroma, and the Hickory Museum of Art have come together to change lives of colorblind individuals. Thanks to a donation of EnChroma glasses, colorblind correcting lenses, from EnChroma, paired with the Long View Lions Club partnering with the Hickory Museum of Art, art patrons are able to experience the museum n color.

The magic of color has the power to create beautiful and emotion filled moments. The first patron to try the glasses had tears brought to her eyes and those who got to share the moment with her. A lady and her husband were visiting Hickory for a couple days to see what the city had to offer; they were considering moving and wanted to do some exploring On their 12th wedding anniversary, they came to the Hickory Museum of Art not knowing that their lives would be changed. The patron repeatedly said that her cheeks were hurt rom smiling so much. For the first time in her life, she experienced the color red and the diversity of green. Before trying the glasses, reds had always looked brown to her and greens all looked the same. We hope that this couple enjoyed their stay in Hickory and the community support that IS Hickory.

The trial EnChroma glasses remain at the museum for patrons to test as we try and find a glasses recipient. Most recently a group of colorblind siblings tried the glasses together. It was an especially emotional experience for the eldest who is an avid artist of her own. At home this teen labels her paints, but for the first time she was able to truly experience color. Since starting the glasses loan, six individuals have experienced art in color.



The Long View Lions in partnership of Walkin' and Roll Activities League, Inc. and Next Home Blue Skies are hosting a winter and coat supply drive to help local less fortunate community members. They are collecting all season long and are distributing the items as they come in, to local charities that work with the less fortunate. So far, have collected over 75 items ranging from coats, sweaters, boots, and more. A special thank you to the Valdese Club for your donations and support to our drive.



The Valdese Lions Club sold Belk Charity Tickets to raise funds to go back into the community. It was a great success. They sold 100 tickets over 10 hours.

PEACE ESSAY BY LION KATHLEEN OF ETOWAH LIONS CLUB

Before I got started on writing this essay I looked at what AI on the computer had to say about peace. It read: "Peace is a state of tranquility, security and harmony in absence of violence or conflict. It can a to a relationship characterised by respect, justice and goodwill." This is a good summation of the definition but how can I put this into practice.

It was also a great opportunity to share some money for items and supplies others need that we can't provide.

Finally, goodwill. The Lions are a wonderful place to share goodwill. Having a positive attitude in all that we do. Inviting and including others in the projects which we are involved. Giving people positive feedback on what they have done and recognize them for their contribution.


If we concentrate our efforts on the small things the big things will happen. Our example shows where our values are.

Carolyn's Kaleidoscope Child Advocacy Center, a program of the Boys and Girls Home of NC that started five years ago recently celebrated national accreditation from the National Children's Alliance. This accreditation will open doors for the center to receive additional funding to serve even more children. 


