





SUMMARY REPORT:

- -District 31L has spent over \$15k on disaster relief, combined funds from LCIF grant and donations from lions clubs out of state. The district continues to receive donations and has an approximate \$10k more that district leaders are making plans on how to best spend.
- -At least 20 of the 46 clubs in District 31L have assisted in Western NC disaster relief efforts. These figures are not final but from available information that has been reported through zone chairs.
 - -At least 11 District31L Lions have had total or partial damage to their homes. To the best of our knowledge, all District 31L Lions are safe. Some have left the state or area to live with family members.
 - -Lions clubs from a minimum of 15 states have assisted with disaster relief by means of volunteer work and sending donations through NCLF and/or District 31L. An exact number is not able to be pinpointed.
- -NCLF most recently reported that they have spent \$84,261 on disaster relief supplies. Since the storm hit on September 27th, NCLF has made multiple weekly trips up the mountain to the impacted areas. With some roads reopening, delivery of supplies has been able to be made through carrier suppliers.
 - -District 31I has received a total of \$30k in grants from LCIF
- -Multiple Distict 311, that is NC, has received a three year \$100k grant. The committee will share more information soon.

IMPORTANT!

In these hard times, we are working to support our community members and lions effected by Hurricane Helene. In being good stewards of funds raised by the public to go to support the public and to maintain the trust of the public, we must remember as we help our communities rebuild

that <u>the Lions International Constitution does not permit public funds to be used benefit a lions club</u>

<u>member.</u>

In supporting the rebuilding of Western North Carolina, this is why donations are being delivered to local churches, food banks, and the like so that donated items are available to all community members. Lions effected by the disaster may benefit if the items are made public and not exclusively to Lions. Additionally, all contributions to the community must be tangible. For example, gift cards may not be passed out to those effected by the disaster. Lions may make personal monetary donations to another lion.

IF YOU WISH TO HELP A FELLOW LION WHO HAS EXPERIENCED GREAT LOSS, CONSIDER ASKING A LOCAL CHURCH OR OTHER CHARITY ENTITY OF LEADING A FUNDRAISER THAT YOU WILL ASSIST WITH; HOWEVER, FUNDS CANNOT BE RAISED FOR A FELLOW LIONS WHILE USING THE LIONS CLUB NAME.
















MERRY CHRISTMAS VIPS...



The Clay County Lions Club is a small but mighty club nestled upon the northern border of the state of Georgia. The lions club first sprouted deep roots with their local community just over a decade after their club's establishment. In 1951 they built a picnic pavilion along Lake Chatuge. Since it's erection, through today, over 70 years later, the lions have stayed a constant in overseeing the financial support and cost of its maintenance with the county. The pavilion is enjoyed and used by many. In 2002 the lions expanded the pavilion and completed a remodel in 2018.

The second large structure project of the Clay County Lions Club was the Town Square Gazebo in 1988. The Lions funded the project and the construction was done by the local high school construction class. In 2018, the lions shared the update costs with the County Commissioners. In the early 1990's the Lions was the sponsor of a very active boy scout troop. The lions secured grants and matching funds and constructed a building for

the scouting program. Over the years it has been used by boy scouts, cub scouts, girl scouts and was used for many years as the Lions Club meeting place.

In 2016 Historic Hayesville Inc was established with a mission to restore, revitalize, and beautify their historic downtown. Together, the Clay County Lions Club along with the other civic organizations of the town, the Chamber of Commerce, Historic & Arts Council, and others specialize and support different projects with grant opportunities under this 501(c)3. It is cohesive bond that has strengthen and highlighted the love for the small town of Hayesville. The program of Historic Hayesville Inc. is an Main Street America Affiliate™ Accredited program. Historic Hayesville Inc. is a recognized leading program among the national network of more than 1,200 neighborhoods and communities that share both a commitment to creating high-quality places and to building stronger communities through preservation-based economic development. All Main Street America™ Accredited programs meet a set of National Accreditation Standards of Performance as outlined by Main Street America.

In addition to the Clay County Lions Club's ongoing project of the picnic pavilion, through Historic Hayesville Inc., they have sponsored and had their hand in many projects benefiting the local community. In 2017 they placed a bicycle rack on the town square for cyclists use. Following this, in 2018 the lions provided the service of designing and handcrafting a limited number of scale models of the courthouse as a fundraiser to support the Clay County Communities Revitalization Association Courthouse Restoration Project. This fundraiser was a great success and asset of the renovation project of the historic courthouse. Without the Clay County Lions Club, many staple structures and the community bonds which they created would not have come about. The Clay County Lions Club has forever left their mark on Hayesville.




















blessed to get a glimpse of seeing another side of late PDG Alan Lake of the Black Mountain Lions Club of our Multiple District 31L.





The LionsUSA Service Committee is Challenging Lions Clubs Across the USA January 12th- January 19th in celebration of Lions International Founder Melvin Jones' birthday to perform as many vision screenings as possible during these days

- 1. Identify a location for the screening.
 - a. School
 - b. Davcare Center
 - c. Religious School
 - d. Children's Camps, Scouting Groups, etc.
 - e. Public Health Fair Event
- Work with location administrators/leaders to select a date between January 12 and 19, 2025. Obtain permission to publicize event prior to and after the screening in traditional and social media.
- 3. Ensure location has proper area with:
 - a. Room large enough for the screening (subject and 2-3 Lions/helpers)
 - b. Adjustable lighting
 - c. Area for "staging" children prior to actually receiving the screening.
 - d. Area for paperwork table
- Explain LionsUSA and the entire project to your club and recruit 4-6 members to be part of the screening team. If necessary, train the Lions on screening process and device operation.
- 5. Ensure you have access to a screening device for your selected date.
 - Suggestion is to coordinate dates with several clubs in your area so each club is screening on a different day.
 One or two devices can then be shared among the clubs so a greater impact can be achieved.
- If required, send the agency for which you are screening permission forms for families to sign. They should be available on screening day. Ensure the child being screened has their own form in hand.
- A week or so prior to the event notify traditional media, inviting them to attend and record. Use social media to

- 9. If you are going to take pictures, please follow the following:
 - a. Only photograph children from behind so they cannot be identified unless you have model releases. Model release forms are included in the "Event Packet" provided.
 - b. If at all possible, photos should include the branded signage referenced above.
- 10. Wearing Lions, Lions KidSight, or LionsUSA vests or other branded clothing will be effective.
- Conduct screening following Lions KidSight best practices. Keep proper records of # screened and referred within each age group. Report this data to the LionsUSA team as well as on the Lions KidSight USA database.
- 12. Celebrate your success by publicizing what you accomplished in traditional and social media.






