

Seventy-four youth and children went "fishing" with us and all were winners. Each participant fished out a prize of a fidget toy, information on how to apply for a fishing license, crayons, and a specialized coloring activity sheet highlighting Lions, the Blind community, fishing, and wildlife officers.

Together, we as Lions of Western North Carolina and District 31L are making a difference in the lives of youth with diabetes. The district sponsored 5 campers, 4 on Medicaid and one child in the foster care system. The Long View Lions Club additionally directly sponsored a student from the local primary school in their town. The Cape Fear Valley Diabetes Adventure Camp ran June 20th-June 23rd at Rockfish Camp where campers had fun while learning how to manage their diabetes independently.

During the 2023-2024 Lions year, the Canton, Etowah, Hendersonville, Mills River, Pisgah Forest, Sherrills Ford cumulatively screened over

1,000 children with 1,474 referrals

and provided assistance to 450 of those individiuals.





This state-wide project led by our 1stVDG Eileen is going well. So far 15 gallons and 4 additional containers filled with broken crayons have been collected. Our district has contributed 2 containers so far. Broken crayons are shipped free of charge to The Crayon Initiative. They then make the crayons new and distribute them to hospital pediatric units.





MONTHLY HIGHLIGHT STORY



"The Youth Exchange Program was authorized by the Lions International Board of Directors in early 1961 after a successful summer-long exchange program between Lions in the United States and Japan. Later, the Youth Camp Program was authorized in 1974. Both aspects of the program were established for the purpose of furthering Lions International's first objective of "creating and fostering a spirit of understanding among peoples of the world."" [Lions Clubs International Youth and Exchange Programs Handbook].

Two of our own clubs within District 31L, Etowah and Erwin District Lions have partaken in this experience. Here's a closer look at one of their stories:

Etowah Lions Club:

In 2017, the Etowah Lions Club hosted Leo Zsofia Komaromi from the country of Hungry. PDG Susan Fernandez and her husband Juan welcomed Zsofia into their home for two weeks and the Etowah Lions Club members shared a memorable visit with her. They shared their Etowah Lions Services Inc. trash service while Zsofia shared about her community service as a Leo back in her hometown of Godollo. Along with sharing inspiration and discussing world events, Zsofia enjoyed American pastimes of shopping, a pedicure, going out to eat, and bonding over television shows. While in the States, Zsofia attended a day camp put on my PDG Susan's neighbor that included an array of teenage fun. Zsofia enjoyed tye-dying, archery, going to the arcade, and playing video games.

PDG Susan shared that hosting Zsofia through the Lions International Youth Exhange program was a life-changing experience. Since hosting her, PDG Susan has visited Zsofia in Hungry twice, most recently a few months ago. PDG Susan shared American baking with Zsofia, one of the things she really wanted to learn while in America, and in return Torok, Zsofia's mom, shared all the traditional Hungarian dishes when PDG Susan and Lion Juan visited them in Hungry. PDG Susan, Juan, Torok, and Zsofia remain great friends and Susan calls Zsofia her "adopted Hungarian daughter." PDG Susan is excited for Zsofia's next stage of life as she recently graduated from university and is going to be an architect.







Majorie McCune was the first blind caseworker with the NC Division for the Blind in Buncombe County. She dreamed of a "happy home" with a compassionate and caring staff that could assist the blind in their daily chores and activities, while restoring their pride and dignity. In the early 1970's she approached the Lions Club with her idea to care for those struggling to care for themselves.

The Lions of Western NC, then known as District 31A, now known as District 31L, responded by forming the Western NC Lions Foundation, Inc. and building the Majorie McCune Center. This center now operates under the name of the Majorie McCune Assisted and Independent Living Community. This community includes a 64-bed facility for those needing assisted living care, 10 independent living cottages, and welcomes not only the blind but persons with a range of various needs.

Memorials and Honorariums to the Majorie McCune Assisted and Independent Living Community are an ideal way to honor a friend or loved one and help the support the Lions of District 31L in their efforts to enhance the physical, emotional, and spirit needs of all residents, with independence, freedom of choice, and dignity in a homelike environment.

The information reported on this will be available to every lion in the district on the password protected portion of the district website. Now all your district service chairperson, zone chairs, and other leaders can extract the information they need from this one form. This form will also replace the points contest form as it will combine district monthly reporting and the points contest form into one.

WHY REPORT?

Collecting data on clubs' service from a club level all the way up to an international level allows us to **build credibility with the community that assists in gaining grants, community visibility, build partnerships with local businesses and charities, and overall community support.** Consider creating a monthly impact statement to share with your club members, non-member volunteers, partnering organizations, and community members.

WHY REPORT ON A DISTRICT LEVEL?

The new lions portal allows any member to view any clubs service projects; however, the viewer must click each individual project to extract the data they need. If a chairperson is looking for a certain type of project by all clubs in the district or is following the service data for multiple clubs, that's a lot of clicks! With a district level, members can have quick access, clubs reporting have one simple form, and we can still report to LCI in the portal for their stats that help with Lions International Foundation grants.
