In these hard times, we are working to support our community members and lions effected by Hurricane Helene. In being good stewards of funds raised by the public to go to support the public and to maintain the trust of the public, we must remember as we help our communities rebuild

that <u>the Lions International Constitution does not permit public funds to be used benefit a lions club</u> <u>member.</u>

In supporting the rebuilding of Western North Carolina, this is why donations are being delivered to local churches, food banks, and the like so that donated items are available to all community members. Lions effected by the disaster may benefit if the items are made public and not exclusively to Lions. Additionally, all contributions to the community must be tangible. For example, gift cards may not be passed out to those effected by the disaster. Lions may make personal monetary donations to another lion.

IF YOU WISH TO HELP A FELLOW LION WHO HAS EXPERIENCED GREAT LOSS, CONSIDER ASKING A LOCAL CHURCH OR OTHER CHARITY ENTITY OF LEADING A FUNDRAISER THAT YOU WILL ASSIST WITH; HOWEVER, FUNDS CANNOT BE RAISED FOR A FELLOW LIONS WHILE USING THE LIONS CLUB NAME.



The support Western North Carolina Relief efforts through donations to North Carolina Lions Foundation is unreal! The support is incredible with Lions and community members from all over the country showering our community with love. As of October 24th, NCLF has received at least \$80k in donations and packages of donations brought from NCLF's Amazon Wish-List are arriving like it is Christmas at Santa's workshop. Additionally, there are at least two more truckloads of donations expected to be delivered by Lions from out of state in the coming weeks including the group of lions from Maryland that collected and drove down donations just a couple of weekends ago. NCLF is continuing to reach out to each club located in the affected areas, inquire their needs, and deliver supplies to them based on their needs from donated items and using donated disaster relief funds to the Foundation. Since, the beginning of the relief efforts weeks ago, NCLF continues to make between four or five trips up the mountain per week.

District 31L has directly received \$4,500 in donations from Lions Clubs across the country including from NC, NY, NH, and more. The \$15k grant from Lions Clubs International Foundation has officially closed. The money was spent to purchase food from MDI that was delivered to affected areas.


