

 - -This would require a single click on every single project from each club a lions leader wanted to see.
 - A district report is not available in the portal system.
- District report only provided to the Global Service Team only includes a number of service projects completed & people served for each global cause, no other details included.
- ~What does district monthly reporting do for me? With one click every lion has access to all the service projects of every club, just scroll to find the desired club, or scroll to get inspiration, ideas, and collaborate.

The updated cumulative district-wide service report will be posted in the district website member portal in the coming days. For help access this, contact Lion Liz Hart.



"I wish I could take away your pain."

"I'm thinking of you and your family." "Your safety is what's most important."

"I'm so sorry you're facing this situation."

"You don't have to go through this alone." "Take all the time you need to process this."

"I'm so sorry for what you're going through."

"I can't imagine how hard this must be for you." "You've got a lot of people who care about you."

"You've been through so much; it is okay to rest."

"It's okay if you don't feel like yourself right now." "It's okay if you are not ready to talk about it yet."

"You've already been so brave through all of this

"You are not alone, even when it feels like you are." "You are allowed to feel upset, angry, or frustrated."

"Let me know if you need a break from everything."

"It is completely normal to feel how you are feeling."

"You've made it through the worst; now it's time to heal." "It's okay to feel shaken but know that you are still standing."

"Don't worry about anything, just focus on yourself right now."

"There's no right or wrong way to feel after something like this."

"How are you feeling today? No pressure to talk, just checking in."

"You're not expected to be 'okay' right now. Take the time you need."







Growing up in Lionism:

My dad was in lions over 50 years. As a young girl, I remember him dressing up to go to meetings. On Ladies night, mom would do the same. Some meetings would be held at a member's home. My brothers, sisters, and I loved it when mom hosted because we were allowed to help serve refreshments. It was a thrill for us to walk into the living room to be with so many finely dressed men and women. Growing up, over the years, I would gain many more memories including as a teenager campaigning for dad when he was running for District Governor and going door to door selling mops, brooms, and light bulbs.

From a young age, my parents taught my siblings and me to show love and to help anyone in need. In the early 80's my parents started a local food bank out of our family store, Khouri's

Department Store. The Lions Club took over the food bank when it became too much to handle which they still run to this day, the Cherokee County Food Bank, Inc.

Joining the Lion Pride:

After I retired, I joined the Lions Club in honor of my dad. At the time, he was in the nursing home and not able to remain actively involved in Lions; however, his memory is forever engrained in our community and our Lions Club. Our club named an award in his honor that I have been humbled to receive. I have served as President for the last five years and look forward to mentoring our Vice President who is stepping up in July along with continuing all the other community service work in which I am involved. Andrews is a little mountain town with a big heart, and I LOVE being a lion.







Leaving a Legacy Remembering Late PDG Joe El-Khouri





In 2014, the N.C. Department of Transportation named Bridge No. 92 in Andrews the "Joe El-Khouri Bridge." The Joe El-Khouri Bridge spans over the Valley River at Robbinsville Road and Wilhide Street.



Joe was a father, husband, military veteran, and devoted community member by various means including a Lion. He was a native of Lebanon and came to the United States in 1949 where he would meet his wife to be Rose. Shortly after Joe became a naturalized citizen, Rose and Joe moved to their forever home, Andrews, NC where they raised 7 children. They purchased and operated Khouri's Department Store for over 30 years and started a food bank out of the department store when they saw the need amongst their customers. This food bank is still under operation under the name of Cherokee County Food Bank, Inc. by the Andrews Lions Club.

The El-Khouri's were the town's first Catholics and held the first Catholic masses in their home. In addition to being an active member of the Andrews Lions Club and serving as District Governor in 1971-1972, Joe was also a board member of Western Carolina University Board of Visitors, Cherokee County United Way, the American Red Cross, Andrews Chamber of Commerce, Board of the Daniel Boone Council of Boy Scouts, and many other area and statewide organizations. There is much more that could be said about the beautiful family of Joe and Rose El-Khouri. Their hearts were strong in community service, Lions, and their town of Andrews. They will forever be remembered.








